Information on Annotated Bibliographies can be found in Section 9.51 of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (7th ed.) The format of your annotated bibliography follow the same format as any APA paper. Title page, page numbers, font style and size, etc.

Example of an annotated bibliography entry: Writing an Annotation. An annotated bibliography is composed of the full APA reference for a source followed by notes and commentary about that source. The word " annotate " means " critical or explanatory notes " and the word " bibliography " means " a list of sources " .

An annotated bibliography is a type of student paper in which reference list entries are followed by short descriptions of the work, called annotations. Annotated bibliographies can also constitute one element of a research paper in fields that require bibliographies rather than reference lists.

Creating-Annotated-Bibliographies-Based-on-APA-Style

Consider the purpose of your annotated bibliography and/or your instructor ' s directions when deciding how much information to include in your annotations. Annotated-Bibliography-Example--MLA-and-APA-Format

An annotated bibliography is a list of citations for various books, articles, and other sources on a topic. The annotated bibliography looks like a Reference page but includes an annotation after each source cited. An annotation is a short summary and/or critical evaluation of a source.

Annotated Bibliography Example in APA Format. The APA format is not that different from the MLA one. Here, however, you detail the author's full last name and first name initials. The publication date comes after the author's last name, initials. Afterward, write the book/article title, issue/number, and place of publication. Here is an example: Example:

An annotated bibliography is an organized list of sources (like a reference list). It differs from a straightforward bibliography in that each reference is followed by a paragraph length annotation, usually 100–200 words in length.

Write-an-Annotated-Bibliography--APA-Style--UMGC-Library

The bibliographic information : Generally, though, the bibliographic information of the source (the title, author, publisher, date, etc.) is written in either MLA or APA format.
