If the dental bridge is a fixed (permanent) bridge, your dentist may temporarily cement it in place for a couple of weeks to make sure it is fitting properly. After a couple weeks, the bridge is permanently cemented into place.

The gums can become diseased, as can the periodontium (tissues surrounding and supporting the teeth which maintain them in the jaw) which can lead to tooth loss. If a bridge is placed with existing gingivitis, the gingivitis will be exacerbated and abutment teeth will loosen.

A dental bridge, as the name implies, literally “bridges” the space between teeth that results from a missing tooth. Therefore, the restoration needs anchoring to one or more neighboring teeth, which your dentist will have to file down so they can function as a support. Bridges don’t replace your tooth root like implants.

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
